DEPUTY PRINCIPALS REPORT

Term 4 is a busy but exciting time at Erskine Park High School. Students will be completing their examinations and wrapping up their learning for 2018. Teachers are busy writing reports and many are externally marking the HSC examinations after school. As a school we celebrate the achievements of the year at our recognition assemblies and presentation evening.

Year 12 celebrated the conclusion of their school life coming together at their formal at Twin Creeks Golf Club. Thank you to the year advisers, Mrs Macinate and Mr Bisolgo for their organisation of this outstanding event. Our students looked spectacular!

For Year 12 it is an anxious wait for the release of their HSC results. Results are released on Thursday 13th December. ATAR information will be available to students from 7:00am, Friday 14th December 2018. Release of results will be via the Results and ATAR

app and website. Students are invited back to school for a BBQ to celebrate their HSC results with their teachers on Friday 14th December in the school's Drama amphitheatre.

Year 11 started their HSC journey this term. The content learnt in class, assessment tasks all contribute to their HSC. It is important students manage their time effectively moving into 2019. Completing assessment tasks on time, completing homework and having a regular study pattern is crucial for the next 4 terms. It is the responsibility of the student to catch on any work missed due sick days, sporting events and TAFE courses. I encourage all students to seek assistance from their teacher if they are struggling with the course content or assessment tasks. Many teachers have started before or after school tutorials to help student revise class work. Some students have reduced their study load by dropping to 5 subjects. This allows their timetable to have study periods for students to access the Library and complete homework and assessment tasks or create study notes. These are not free periods.

Year 10 are in their last weeks of junior schooling. They have chosen their subjects for 2019 and the timetable is in progress. Many students will undertake work experience during weeks 7 and 8. This is an important time for students to experience their career aspirations.

During this term students will also prepare for studying in Year 11. Most students have completed the mandatory online NESA course 'All my own work' during the CLUES lessons earlier this term. Those who have not completed the course will be given an opportunity in the Library over the next few weeks. Failure to do this will require the student to organise the completion of the course themselves prior to the commencement of the Preliminary HSC at the beginning of next year. The course was an online activity which delivered modules designed to support students in making appropriate decisions with respect to copyright and plagiarism.

On Tuesday 11th December, Year 10 into 11 enrolment day will take place. Students, and parents, are invited to the school for a presentation on how to maximise their HSC, expectations of a senior student and to pay contributions 2019 subjects.

Year 6 into 7 orientation will be held on Tuesday 11th December. This is a great opportunity of students starting Year 7 at Erskine Park High School next year. Students and their parents are invited to the hall for an introduction to high school life. Students will familiarise themselves with the school by meeting

their class group, year advisers, Mr Darwin Mendoza and Mrs Hayley Crowshaw. Students partake in mini lessons across the school while parents have the opportunity to purchase book packs, purchase uniforms and pay contributions. A BBQ will be held to conclude the morning.

As this is my last newsletter for the year, I would like to take this opportunity to wish our students and their families a safe, relaxing and happy holiday. I have thoroughly enjoyed my role as a Deputy Principal at Erskine Park High School over the past 3 Terms, in particular working with the student in Years 8, 10 and 12.

ENGLISH REPORT

"What is the point of being alive if you don't at least try to do something remarkable?" —from An Abundance of Katherines by John Green

It has been a busy start to Term 4 in the English Faculty! We said farewell to Miss Healy, and congratulated her on the birth of her son. We have welcomed Mr Woodland and Mrs Morrison to English for the remainder of the year. We have begun new units of work in junior years and the new Year 12 HSC courses. We have also had students involved in the Year 9 Rotary Public Speaking competition, Fiction Frenzy with Year 7 and Year 6 JEPS students, and the Poetry in Action live performance.

What are we studying?

Year 7 have just finished their Fiction Frenzy unit, culminating in a presentation of the best projects in the library along with students from JEPS. Students had a great time selecting their own novel and building on their analytical and technological skills as they produced a range of visual, written, and multimodal pieces. They are now commencing their final unit of the year, Mythical and Magical Worlds.





Year 8 are enjoying their genre study of Horror this term, investigating a range of texts from Poe to The Simpsons adaptations, with a major focus on creating their own narrative pieces of writing.

Year 9 are investigating how Japanese culture is represented in a range of texts, from the anime films Howl's Moving Castle and Spirited Away, to haiku, short stories, and manga. This was supported by a visit from Poetry In Action, who performed a range of poetry, including that of Japanese poet Basho.





Year 10 classes are completing a drama unit, with classes completing close studies of plays, and investigating different elements of playmaking. Their current assessment task asks them to apply their new knowledge and skills and write the opening of their own play.

Year 11/12: Our Year 11 students have started the HSC course, with English Studies, English Advanced and English Standard all currently completing the Common Module – Texts and Human Experiences. The Advanced classes are studying The Crucible, while Standard and Studies students are looking at Billy Elliot. Our Extension 1 students are looking at a range of texts and how literary worlds are created whilst our Extension 2 candidates have begun the creative process of developing their own texts.

PREMIERS ANZAC MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

By now many students in both Year 9 and Year 10 are aware of the Premiers Anzac Memorial Scholarship. One student from Erskine Park High School will be

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awarded the scholarship and take part in a study tour of historic war sites in Germany, France and Belgium. Below are criteria and outlines

Scholarship Criteria

A student applying for a Premier's Anzac Memorial Scholarship must:

- be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia
- be enrolled in Year 9 or 10 in 2018
- turn 16 years of age by the 27 September 2019, the departure date of the 2019 tour
- be studying history in Year 11, if in Year 11 in 2019
- intend to study history in Year 11 if in Year 10 in 2019
- be a positive contributor to the school community
- be able to follow very high standards of behaviour, dress and protocol
- be independent, trustworthy and able to complete tasks by specified deadlines
- be medically, physically and emotionally fit to participate in the tour
- display a genuine interest in Australian history, including the role that participation in wars has played in the development of Australia.

accept the following conditions:

- have parental/caregiver permission to participate.
- agree to participate in media interviews should they be requested and to appear on official NSW Government websites. The Office for Veterans Affairs will carefully monitor information that is made public.
- produce a piece of work, as part of the scholarship, that may be publishe

To qualify, students must submit a piece of work on one or more of the following themes

- The importance of commemoration
- · The effect of wars on communities in Australia
- · The impact of wars on returned soldiers
- · The role of women in both wars

Possible formats include

- Essay of 1000 words (word count does not include references or footnotes)
- Poem of short story
- Video presentation (maximum 3 minutes)

- Musical composition a song or instrumental. A written exposition of 500 words explaining how the composition relates to the chosen theme must be included
- Web page or powerpoint
- Artwork painting, drawing, photograph or textile.
 A written exposition of 500 words explaining how the artwork relates to the chosen theme must be included


